#### **Security Launches Security Incident Reporting System**

Campus Security is going live today with their new security incident reporting system. This new system "SIRS" is Web-based and will move the department from handwritten report writing and tracking to online reporting. SIRS will automatically track Clery reports (required of U.S. colleges and universities to disclose information about crime on and around their campuses) and can e-mail departments when they are directly involved with an incident.

**Sgt. Charles Mettille** worked with Competitive Edge software from Wisconsin to implement the new system. "We understand that with anything new there is a learning curve," said **Bill Keener**, Security and Public Safety Supervisor. "The hands-on training we received was superb and the officers are excited to begin using the new system." The system was implemented in response to the Security Task Force recommendation. "With the assistance of **Bobby Royal**, Dean of WACC, Community Affairs and Security, we were able to get SIRS up and running," Keener said.

The Summer Criminal Justice Institute, funded under the Tech Prep grant, offers teens the opportunity to explore the many facets of criminal justice careers. The teens, students at the Cape May County Technical High School, saw in-person demonstrations on campus and took two field trips to the FAA Tech Center and a law enforcement expo in Atlantic City. 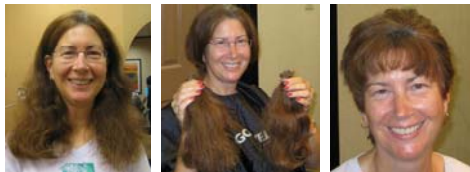
