#### Recruitment

- Atlantic Cape hosted its Early College Program's Annual Media Day at the Mays Landing campus on October 27<sup>th</sup> under the leadership of Bojan Zilovic, Professor of Computer Science and Media Studies. Students from six local high schools learned about the latest technological media and communication innovations, trends and educational opportunities available to them at the college. The event also featured a keynote speaker, Scott Grayson, the sports anchor from Fox 29 Philadelphia news channel, who spoke about how he parlayed his love of sports into his career in the media industry. The students also attended workshops focusing on creative writing, social media mastery, photography, Steadicams, on-air radio production, news writing, drone flight operations and digital media production.
- Atlantic Cape's Student Affairs and Enrollment Management team participated in the Atlantic City Youth Service's Viking Week: College and Career Week at Atlantic City High School from October 23<sup>rd</sup>-27<sup>th</sup>. This included a long week celebration in which Atlantic Cape hosted several career and information workshops, instant decision, as well as panel discussions. Some of the departments represented included Center for Student Success, Recruitment, and Athletics.
- Atlantic Cape's Recruitment team hosted an information table at *Borgata's Employee Benefit's Event* on October 30<sup>th</sup>, to share all educational resources and opportunities available through Atlantic Cape from Workforce training programs to two-year degree programs.

 The Center for Student Success hosted a Registration Prep Rally on Tuesday, November 14<sup>th</sup>. Sponsored by the Student Support Services Program, this rally allows students to meet with student navigators to pre-register for Winter/Spring 2024 courses.

### **Community Outreach – Atlantic County**

- Atlantic Cape's Public Safety department hosted a free workshop "JUST IN CASE: Free Opioid Awareness & Narcan Training" on October 24<sup>th</sup>. The workshop was presented by the Atlantic County Division of Public Health, Substance Abuse Services at both our Atlantic City and Mays Landing campuses. Students, faculty, staff, and community members who attended the event learned how identify the signs and symptoms of an opioid overdose and how to administer Narcan. Atlantic County has the highest opioid overdose death rate (per capita) in New Jersey. In response, Atlantic Cape Community College now has Narcan available, through the public safety office, on all three campuses.
- Atlantic Cape partnered with the Family Success Center and HOPE Exist to host the Veterans Resource Fair and Mini Stand Down on our Worthington Atlantic City Campus on November 8<sup>th</sup>. This event played an active role in helping Veterans obtain crucial resources, goods and services. Captain Jerome Ingram, Student Service Navigator, also presented at this event and hosted a veterans informational table for Atlantic Cape. Over hundred veterans were serviced at the event.
- In partnership with the Southern Jersey Family Medical Center and the Atlantic City Board of Education, Atlantic Cape hosted a *Thanksgiving Family Meal Kit* food distribution on our Worthington Atlantic City Campus on November 18<sup>th</sup>.
   We provided over 300 Atlantic City families with a turkey, fresh produce, and a box with sides to accompany their Thanksgiving meals.

 Lizbeth Castro and Jean McAlister represented Atlantic Cape and congratulated the Board President of the New Jersey Hispanic Leadership Association at their 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Gala on October 28<sup>th</sup>. # **University Partnership Update**

 Fairleigh Dickinson will no longer offer degree-completion and graduate programs in-person at New Jersey Community Colleges. Atlantic Cape Community College has been part of this program since 2002. Farleigh Dickinson cited declining enrollment in recent years as the reason for ending these programs. However, Atlantic Cape will maintain its transfer agreements with Farleigh Dickinson for our Culinary Arts and Hospitality programs.

#### **Foundation**

 In recognition for their outstanding contributions and for helping to serve others in the community, the Atlantic Cape Community College Foundation and the Cape May County Women's Commission honored Tracey BoyleDuFault, Sandra Lockhart, Terri Mascione and Jennifer Shirk at the 2023 *Women of Wonder Luncheon* on Thursday, November 2<sup>nd</sup> at The Flanders Hotel in Ocean City.
