 Atlantic Cape hosted the Cape May County bizHub Ribbon Cutting Ceremony on September 6<sup>th</sup> at the Cape May County Campus. The bizHub is a small business resource center that was developed to address the unique needs of

### **Legislature Breakfast**

• The Chamber of Commerce of Southern New Jersey (CCSNJ) recently hosted US Senator Cory Booker at their Legislative Breakfast. Dr. Gaba personally thanked Senator Booker for, his support of the college for funding of our Cape May County BizHub (\$212,000), a resource for small businesses and entrepreneurs. Additionally, the CCSNJ sponsored the attendance of Student Government Association (SGA) President and Officer, Sultana Zakia and Michael Heston, along with Ibrihim Goodman, Men of Atlantic Cape (MAC) member. These student leaders were also able to meet Senator Booker and network with many of the businesses that were represented.

# **Technology Upgrades**

 We have converted the Cape May and Atlantic City campuses from Coax cabling to Fiber with our third-party vendor, Windstream. Fiber will improve phone connectivity issues until the phone system is upgraded and migrated to the cloud. The Mays Landing Campus will be converted in late Sept or October.

# **Community Outreach – Atlantic County**

 Councilman Kaleem Shabazz invited Dr. Gaba to speak at Lt. Governor's Shelia Oliver's Memorial Service at the Second Baptist Church in Atlantic City on August 31<sup>st</sup>. Dr. Gaba spoke about the legacy of Lt. Governor Oliver, noting

- that she was a champion of the underserved, a champion for Atlantic City, a champion for New Jersey and a champion for Atlantic Cape Community College.
- Dr. Gaba spoke at the Atlantic City NAACP's meeting, hosted at the
  Worthington Atlantic City Campus, on September 11<sup>th</sup>. Dr. Gaba spoke about
  the college, focusing on affordability, flexibility, convenience; and the myriad
  opportunities available to our students and community. The Worthington
  Atlantic City Campus is proud to host the Atlantic City NAACP's meetings for
  the rest of the year.
- Atlantic Cape sponsored the "Out of the Darkness Walk" presented by the American Association for Suicide Prevention at the Atlantic City boardwalk hosted by Hard Rock Casino & Hotel on September 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Over 750 community members participated to create awareness around suicide. Atlantic Cape's community outreach team was on hand to share college information and resources as well as water and fresh fruit for walk participants.
- Atlantic Cape partnered with the City of Atlantic City to co-sponsor the
   *Peruvian Consulate* at our Worthington Atlantic City Campus on September 9<sup>th</sup>,
   2023. The Peruvian Consulate provided services to 250 families that included
   Passport, DNI (National Identification Documentation), and Public
   Notarizations of deeds. The City of Atlantic City presented the college with a
   certificate of appreciation for our partnership.
- Atlantic Cape invited the Boys and Girls Club of Atlantic City to the Mays
   Landing Campus for an event to celebrate the annual Boys and Girls Club
   National Day on September 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023. The Atlantic Cape recruitment team held
   tours, refreshments, and games. Boys & Girls Clubs of America is a national,
   nonprofit organization which provides programs and services to promote and
   enhance the development of boys and girls by instilling a sense of
   competence, usefulness, belonging and influence.
- The Coalition for a Safe Community hosted a community walk in partnership with FBI agencies (Atlantic City and Newark offices), the Atlantic County Prosecutor's Office, and local and state law enforcement. The purpose of the walk is to bridge communications and support between residents and law

enforcement. The Coalition for a Safe Community is a body of community members and organizations dedicated to improving and empowering residents to sustain safe communities in Atlantic City and Pleasantville. Members of this Coalition include Dr. Gaba and Trustee Dawson.
